#### Dear Patrons:

The Greenwood Lake Public Library experienced a busy year in 2003. Our summer reading program was again a huge success. We debuted many diverse adult and children's programs in the new program room, which were well received. We added a morning coffee bar for the convenience and comfort of our patrons. The fourth grade classes from the elementary school began visiting us once a week for "free time" reading material and, on additional days, to do project research.

Several community groups have also utilized the library's program room. The Lions, the Leos, the Greenwood Lake Revitalization Committee, the Rowing Club, Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, PTSA, Elementary School Faculty, school tutors, Literacy Volunteer tutors and Village Pre-school graduation ceremonies have all benefited by the construction of this comfortable and fully equipped meeting space.

The circulation of library materials continues to increase, as does the use of the ten public access computers. We have added a collection of reference school textbooks, grades 1 through 8, to assist students and parents in completing homework assignments. The adult non-fiction collection continues to be weeded and upgraded ensuring the availability of pertinent and accurate information at the local library level.

The "Friends of the Library" purchased a standing display case for the purpose of community residents showcasing personal collections. Through the diligent efforts of Mrs. Kelly Corrado, one of the library's very important volunteer friends, these display cases have featured two different collections each month. Mrs. Corrado interviews each collector, includes a short bio with the collection, and arranges for local newspaper coverage. This collector's opportunity has proven very popular and boasts a long waiting list.

The coming year should prove to be equally exciting as we are planning to open a Young Adult Study Center in cooperation with the Village of Greenwood Lake. We are grateful for the continued support from our community. Our Annual Meeting to vote on the upcoming year's library budget and the election of two trustee seats is Thursday, May 20, 2004 from 2–8PM.

### BRAND NEW! A LIBRARY BUS TRIP!

Join us Thursday, June 17th on our <u>FIRST</u> bus trip to the Westchester Broadway Theatre to enjoy dinner and the brilliant musical, "Miss Saigon!" "Miss Saigon" is a classic love story, brought up-to-date in one of the most stunning theatrical spectacles of all time. In "Miss Saigon," Alain Boublil and Claude-Michael Schönberg (the creators of "Les Misérables"), along with Richard Maltby, Jr., bring Puccini's "Madame Butterfly" to the modern world in a moving testament to the human spirit and a scathing indictment of the tragedies of war.

The bus will leave from the Greenwood Lake Public Library at 4:30PM, arriving at the Westchester Broadway Theatre in Elmsford, NY (an approximately 40 mile trip) between 5:30-6PM. We will be departing at approximately 10:30PM, arriving back at the library between 11:30PM-12AM.

This program will cost \$67.00 per person, which covers round-trip bus transportation, dinner, the show and tip. Coffee and tea are included. Soft drinks, cocktails and appetizers are not included and if you choose to order them, the waiter will bill you separately.

Registration is in person at the library and the fee of \$67.00 is due at the time of registration. Young adults between the ages of 16 and 18 may register, but they must register with and be accompanied on the trip by a parent or guardian.

### ONGOING PROGRAMS CONTINUED

Independent Film Nights - Join us the second Tuesday evening of every month for screenings of independent films that fly under the popular radar. Each month we show a new independent film in the library's program room; light refreshments are served as well. This program is FREE, but registration is suggested, either in person or by phone (477-8377 Ext. 10). The current film schedule is as follows:

April: Ali Zaoua (Moroccan film with English subtitles)

Ali, Kwita, Omar & Boubker are a group of street urchins living in Casablanca. Their lives are filled with violence, begging, and indifference. In order to survive, they create a bond of friendship and family between them; the bond is cut short when Ali is senselessly killed. His friends decide not to report his death to the police, who would have the boy buried in a potter's field—instead they decide to give him a worthy burial on the private island of which he so often dreamed.

May: Carol's Journey (Spanish film in English)

Carol, a 12-year-old Spanish-American girl from New York, travels to Spain in 1938, at the height of the Civil War. Separated from her beloved father, she arrives in her mother's home village and transforms the secretive family environment. Her innocence and rebellious nature drive her at first to reject a world that is at once new and foreign, but she soon journeys into adulthood through a friendship with Maruja, the village teacher, and a young buy, Tomiche.

June: Inch' Allah Dimanche (Algerian film with English subtitles) Following WWII, France attempted to replenish its weakened workforce by recruiting men from North Africa. In the 1970s the French government relaxed its immigration policy to allow the families of Algerian men to join them. This film provides us with a deeply moving memoir of the sense of isolation and vulnerability that the immigrant families experience upon arrival in France at the time when racial integration was virtually non-existent.

### Collectible Corner

The Collectible Series, sponsored by the Friends of the Greenwood Lake Public Library, features local collectors and their treasures. These collections are on display at the library on a rotating basis, with new collections exhibited every two weeks in the "Kool Kids Kollectibles," "Terrific Teens Treasures," "Awesome Adults Acquirements," or "Sensational Seniors Selections." Recent collections featured were Alison Toscano's "Beanie Babies," Emily Creighton's "Pollys," Liam Heslin's "Animals, " Samantha Bermudez's "Collectible Dolls," Eric Marren's "Comics," Kelly Corrado's "Santas" and "Jumbo Ornaments," Holly Figueroa's "Snowmen," and Elizabeth Freaney's "Mermaids."
