To the Taxpayers of the Greenwood Lake Union Free School District:

On behalf of the Greenwood Lake Public Library's Board of Trustees, I would like to thank the Greenwood Lake School District voters for passing your library's budget on May 20, 2004 and electing Jane Santarpia and Laura Ronayne as trustees. As district residents and taxpayers, we made it our priority to construct a budget that provides increased services without increasing taxes. Your overwhelming support confirmed our earnest efforts to maintain a library that serves an integral role in our community.

For those who prefer hard numbers, we present the following: the library added 5,496 items last year and now owns over 44,997 library materials; 87,076 items were circulated and an additional 32,078 items were used within the library; the library was open to the public over 3,100 hours; 4,538 patrons are registered borrowers and there were 104,255 visits made to our library last year; 5,928 adults and children attended 287 program sessions; the library staff answered 22,307 reference questions.

Throughout the year, the library receives donations in memory of loved ones. This past year our community experienced the loss of both Everett and Viola Cox, Senior. Mr. and Mrs. Cox were avid readers and generous in many quiet ways to the community. Mr. Cox served as a library trustee and over \$2,700 in memorial contributions has been sent to the library by their loved ones, associates and friends.

Through the Orange County Library Association, the Orange County Legislature has again recognized the importance of Orange County public libraries. This past year, the Greenwood Lake Public Library received \$6,349.06, greatly assisting our efforts in providing the community with up-to-date computer technology and services. We are grateful to have local legislators who understand and support this important service that is equally available to all.

As the library staff continues to provide conventional and reliable library services and programming, they also continue to plan and implement new programming and services not typically offered by a "Public Library". An ongoing Scrabble evening for adult players is offered on Tuesdays twice a month and Independent Film Tuesday is offered once a month. Both programs are new and have proven very successful. This past fall we opened a coffee station for the comfort of our morning patrons and it has become so popular it will continue year-round.

If you have not visited your library, we urge you to visit soon and take advantage of all the library has to offer. The library is open 7 days a week so why not stop in and see how your money has been put to work.
