

On behalf of the Board of Trustees and Staff, I would like to express our thanks to the residents of the the Greenwood Lake Union Free School District for passing our 2011-2012 budget. Please accept our sincere gratitude for your vote of confidence, which will allow us to continue to provide the level of service that you have come to expect from the Library. The 2011-2012 fiscal year budget passed 72 to 8 and Robert F. Fraser, incumbent trustee, was re-elected with 68 votes.

We look forward to seeing you all in our new fiscal year!

Summer Reading Program Registration

Registration in the *Summer Reading Program* is open to all Greenwood Lake School District children and is required in order to be eligible to attend all other supplemental programs. Separate registration is required for each of these supplemental programs and can be done on the day you register for the program. **All children must have a valid Library card with them to register; new cards are available at the Front Desk. Children ages 2 through entering Grade 6 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian to register.**

As listed in our Spring Newsletter, registration for the Summer Reading Program and supplemental events will be held on Wednesday, June 22nd (12-3 p.m. & 5-7 p.m.), Thursday and Friday, June 23rd & 24th (10 a.m.-3 p.m.), and Saturday, June 25th (10 a.m.-12 p.m.). After June 25th, registration will be ongoing. *Register early; many of the supplemental programs fill quickly!*

This year's 2011 state-wide Summer Reading Program themes are "**One World, Many Stories**" for Ages 2 to entering 6th Grade and "**You Are Here**" for tweens and teens entering Grades 7 and up. *Join the fun all summer long!*





Also on display will be a phone book from 1946-47 of the greater Greenwood Lake area. Both items were acquired by the Seccaficos when the Humphrey's sold the hotel.

"The Early Days of ... Portraits of Greenwood Lake Residents"

On display will be historical photos of the early residents of Greenwood Lake showcased by life-long Greenwood Lake resident, Charlotte Santopietro.

"The Early Days of ... Button Hooks"

In Memory of a Friend

The late Agnes Kilduff, was recently honored by the Village of Greenwood Lake with the dedication of "Sonshine Park." Agnes' license plate read, "Sonshine," in honor of her two sons. The Village's tribute was a moving and thoughtful celebration of Agnes' life.

Agnes was a long-time Village trustee and liaison to the Library. As liaison, Agnes was always sure to promote Library events and was willing to bring Library concerns to the Village; she was a true proponent of community cooperation. However, long before Agnes was the Village Trustee's liaison to the Library, she was involved in the Friends of the Library from 1989-96. Agnes organized craft fairs, fashion shows, bake sales, raffles, etc. Back when our Library was just one little room with a limited budget, Agnes and her Friends Group worked extremely hard to raise much needed funds to support programming and whatever else the Library might need.

We are grateful to Agnes for her support throughout the years as a liaison to the Library and in her capacity as a Friend of the Library. The Greenwood Lake community has lost a true "Friend" who will always be missed.

A Thank You to a Friend

We are saddened to tell you that Kelly Corrado, who has served in a voluntary capacity as President of Friends of the Library since 2003 and creator and advisor of the Junior Friends of the Library since 2007, will be resigning from the Friends' Groups. (She will continue in her employee capacity as Coordinator of Adult Services, Special Programs, Publicity, and Promotions for the Library.) Kelly worked extremely hard on brainstorming to develop and implement many unique and profitable fundraisers, and in continually promoting the fundraisers and the Library in general. The amount of personal time she devoted to these efforts is incalculable.

During her years with the FOL and JFOL, Kelly led the groups in raising over \$12,000.00 for the Library. However, Kelly's contributions to the Library have been far more important than money. She created good will throughout the community with fundraisers, like the Senior Citizen Prom, and developed a spirit of generous cooperation with local merchants and patrons who contributed many times to her fundraisers through their donations of food, prizes, money, or time. Kelly motivated a group of tweens and teens to become involved in the Library in a meaningful and fun-filled way. These young volunteers had many of their own individual fundraisers, such as the Snow Ball, Car Washes, and Candy and Bake sales. The JFOL also worked hard in support of the FOL's Senior Citizen Prom and 3-Day Book Sale fundraisers. It takes a very special person to keep a group of young people inspired to work as hard as they did for as long as they did. The Library is, of course, also very grateful to all of Kelly's Friends and Junior Friends.

The Board of Trustees, Director, and Staff would like to express our gratitude and appreciation to Kelly for her hard work on the behalf of the Library. We wish her well and hope that she enjoys this new time in her life.

We are most grateful for donations of materials to the Library. However, because of lack of space, we are unable to store excess donations that we cannot use or are unlikely to sell. Please note the following when considering donating materials to the Library:

1. Call ahead before bringing donations to the Library to Elizabeth Cisek, Ext. 105, or Jill Cronin, Ext. 109 or 110. Please leave a message if they are unavailable; they will return your call.
2. Donations of books in print, books on CD, puzzles, video games, board games, or DVDs should be in reasonable amounts (no more than a box or bag full).
3. We do not accept videos, books on tape, textbooks, magazines, Reader's Digest condensed books, or encyclopedias.
4. The items donated and their container must be free of mildew and dirt. Mildew is contagious and spreads to other books.
5. The Library reserves the right to use material donations for our collection or Book Sale. If the Library determines the material to be inappropriate for either our collection or our Book Sale, the Library reserves the right to discard it.
6. All donations should be brought into the Library during operating hours and should not be left outside the Library after hours. Any donations left outside are immediately discarded because of possible insect/rodent infestation as well as dampness issues.
