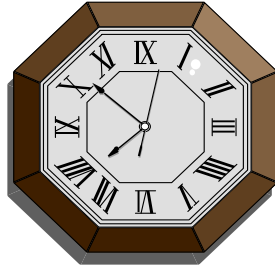

Inclement Weather Policy

The closing policy for the library is as follows:

- If the schools are on a delayed opening, the library is on the same delay.
 - If school is closed, the library is on a 2 hour delay. The decision to open the library or remain closed is made by 10AM.
 - Children's programs that are scheduled during the hours of a library delayed opening or closing are cancelled.
 - The library may close early during a day or evening when the weather is inclement.
