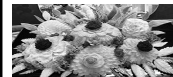

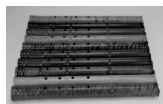

BOOK LOVER'S CLUB REVIEW—"Unsheltered" by Barbara Kingsolver

Unsheltered is a novel about what happens to us when we find ourselves in danger of becoming "unsheltered"; both literally and figuratively. Barbara Kingsolver sets the story in a house in Vineland NJ, weaving together the stories of 2 families who lived in the house 150 years apart. The current residents (the Knox's) are a multigenerational family struggling to make ends meet even though they feel they have done everything right throughout their lives. The parents have lost their jobs, their son has incurred huge college debt, their daughter is on a quest to save the earth and their grandson has lost his mother. On top of all this, the house is literally falling down around them. Their counterparts in the past are also fighting to keep their heads above water. Thatcher Greenwood has moved to the house with his wife, mother-in-law and sister-in-law who do not listen to him as he tells them the house is decrepit.

In each era, while the families work together to find their way through the issues that threaten to leave them "unsheltered" in the literal sense; they also look to find the courage to be "unsheltered" in the figurative sense. Kingsolver keeps our interest throughout and leaves us with the feeling that we can still accomplish much through persistence, love and family.
