## **Letter From the Director**

Welcome back everyone! We're all finally breathing easier this summer. With the pandemic subsiding, we have our small town treasures coming back; standing next to our friends at soccer games, sharing a book without health worries, or having a beer at a lakeside restaurant. After these last 15 months, I have come to view these opportunities as much cherished luxuries. The library is winding its way back to normal as well. We are offering both in-person and virtual programs for our Summer Reading programs. We're looking at welcoming back Girl Scout troops, Moms and Tots, and various other community groups in the fall. As soon as this construction is done, we will have spaces for you to sit and enjoy the daily papers, read the inside flap of a new book or go through our extensive collection of local history. When you come in for whatever reason, you'll actually be "breathing easier" thanks to our new dedicated outdoor air system on the main floor. This project was funded with no debt to the taxpayers and over \$ 174,000 in funds from the NYS Library Construction Aid program. Their support for this valuable resource is making it possible to complete these large infrastructure improvements. We are truly grateful for their efforts on our behalf and for libraries throughout Orange County.

We are always grateful for the support of our community members as well. Thank you all for passing our budget, and for voting in our two new Board of Trustee members, Pat Nolan and Kayla Andrews. We can't wait to see what the next year brings!




