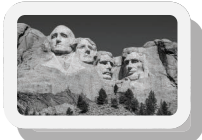
Discover the Tarot

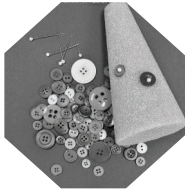
