Happy New Year!

Another year in the history books for Greenwood Lake. With an important anniversary for our community looming just around the corner, we here at the library have noted it on our calendars and our work goals. We received boxes of printed editions of The Buzzer, dating back to 1908, over the last few years from several local residents to add to our growing local history collection. With ongoing financial support from our residents, we have been able to digitize another 1,100 pages of Greenwood Lake history. The Buzzer was a weekly publication that included everything from who was in town for the weekend to where all the best social events were taking place. It is truly delightful to read and should be available online by February.

To further our efforts at archiving our community information, we're asking residents to check their own keepsakes for printed copies of the Greenwood Lake News dating back to 1964. Our current collection of this particular newspaper has big gaps in holdings and we would love to fill in the issues we lack. Even if you just lend them to us to be sent out for digitization, we'd be happy to return them once processing is done. As a thirty year plus resident, I, personally, would like to see this information accessible to all.

Ok, on to other topics. We'd like to thank Senator James Skoufis for his generous allocations of \$17,000 in Bullet Aid to us. It was a wonderful surprise and we will use that funding expeditiously. By the time you see this, we will also have received another \$100,000 from the Library Construction Aid program. I may sound like a broken record but without support from our legislators, from both sides of the aisle, our library would really be struggling. Thank you, Rep. Brabenec and Sen. Skoufis, for making libraries a priority.

Finally, read on, if you haven't already, to see how we prioritize you, our patrons. Don't hesitate to weigh in on what you want. Our work goals will always include that info.


