Are you ready to start celebrating the 100th birthday of our beautiful community? We are! We've added lots more digital content to our online local history collections with more to come. We're proud to be hosting future lectures arranged by the dedicated Centennial Committee members and we've got some library décor coming to enhance those efforts. Show your pride and take part in the various festivities coming in the next year.

Speaking of digital content, we've got some other new resources for you all to use as well. We've added Tutor.com so that students (and parents) can log in and get homework and/or project help after school. With the costs rising for home streaming services, we want to lighten that financial burden on our residents. With that in mind, we've also added Kanopy to our free-to-you streaming services. Kanopy is strictly video content and offers lots of programming from the UK as well as American movies and TV. Hoopla, our other streaming service, has video and musical content but also ebooks and audiobooks that you may have to wait for on Libby, so check them out as well.

I'm proud to say that we continue to receive funding from the NY State Library Construction Aid program which has awarded us another \$131,000 to complete our infrastructure renovations. Additionally, we have been approved for another \$7,500 in Grants in Aid for our Native Gardening initiative through Senator James Skoufis' office. Both the Senator and Representative Karl Brabenec continue to show their support in Albany for libraries in New York State and for us in particular. We are very grateful and are committed to utilizing these funding opportunities whenever we can. We're also grateful to all those who participated in our very busy Summer Reading Programs for residents of all ages. We loved having you in the library as well as using our remote online resources. Summer 2023 is in the history books but we have wonderful Adult, Young Adult and Children's programming coming up this Fall. Make sure you call or click to register to guarantee your spot.
