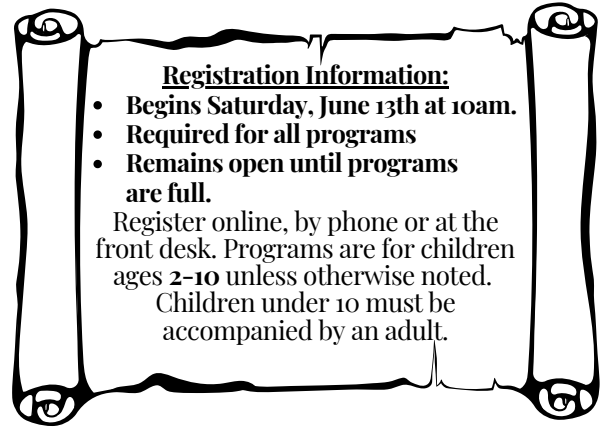
UNEARTH A STORY™

Become a paleontologist for the day! Use special tools to dig, uncover, and identify real fossils, gems and other surprise treasures to take home!



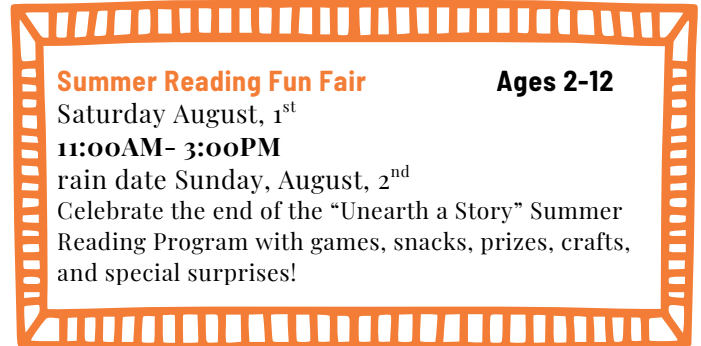
Artifact Exploration with Museum Village

Dinoman Dinosaur Show!

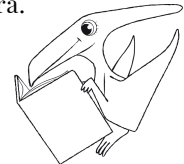

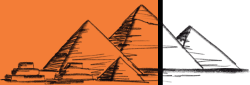


Minecraft® Ancient Egypt Adventure

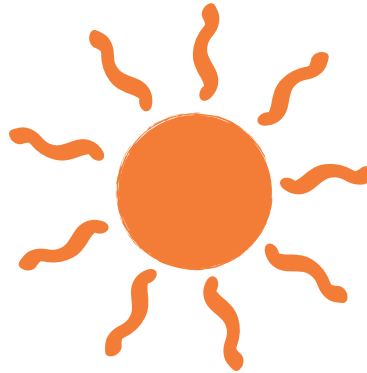
